SPECIAL TEMPORARY ENROLMENT SCHEME: Roydvale School

This scheme commences on 29 May 2013.

Home zone

All students who live within the home zone **described below** (and *shown on the attached map*) shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

The Roydvale Primary School Zone is defined as follows:

The description includes both sides of the road unless otherwise stated

Starting from 73 Grays Road, north to Avonhead Road. Right onto Avonhead Road, to Roydvale Avenue. Left onto Roydvale Avenue. right onto Memorial Avenue, (North side of Memorial Avenue only) to Grahams Road.

Left onto Grahams Road then left onto Cranbrook Avenue. Along Cranbrook Avenue to Kendal Avenue. Right onto Kendal Avenue, then left onto Sledmere Street, right onto Charlcott Street to Wairakei Road.

Left onto Wairakei Road to Breens Road. Along Breens Road to Hockey Street.

Left on to Hockey Street, to the footpath that runs from Hockey Street, through Hockey Park, to Trafford Street. Along Trafford Street to Harewood Road, Left at Harewood Road (South side of Harewood Road only) to Woolridge Road. Along Woodridge Road to Wairakei Road. Right at Wairakei Road to Orchard Road. Left on to Orchard Road. Left to Memorial Avenue, to Ron Guthrey Road (No Exit). An imaginary line will run across from the southern end of Ron Guthrey Road to Avonhead Road.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Former Kendal School students

Students enrolled at Kendal School on the date the Minister announced the closure of Kendal School may be enrolled at Roydvale School, regardless of whether they live within the enrolment scheme home zone described above. Enrolments made under this part of special temporary enrolment scheme must occur either during 2013 or for the start of 2014 school year. This provision will also apply to siblings (not yet at school) of eligible students.

Special programmes

Out of zone enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community

newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

- **First priority** This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary.
- **Second priority** must be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
- **Third priority** must be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
- **Fourth priority** must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
- **Fifth priority** must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
- **Sixth priority** must be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, or fifth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
