

Shirley Boys' High School (321)

Enrolment Scheme

Amendment approved 21/06/18

Effective for the 2019 school year

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under section 11G (3) of the Education Act 1989 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below (and shown on the attached map) shall be eligible to enrol at the school.

Addresses on both sides of boundary roads are included unless stated otherwise.

From the intersection of ANZAC Drive (SH 74) and New Brighton Road;

- West on New Brighton Road to Kingsford Street,
- North on Kingsford Street to Broomfield Terrace,
- West then North on the north east side only of Broomfield Terrace to Horseshoe Lake Road,
- North on the east side only of Horseshoe Lake Road to Lake Terrace Road,
- From the Horseshoe Lake Road / Lake Terrace Road intersection, north to QEII Drive,
- East on QEII Drive to Burwood Road,
- North on Burwood Road to Newhaven Street,
- West on Newhaven Street to Greenhaven Drive,
- North on Greenhaven Drive to Mairehau Road (including Snelling Place and all addresses on Greenhaven Drive),
- East on Mairehau Road to Burwood Road,
 - (including Concord Place and addresses down to 204 Mairehau Road)
- North on Burwood Road to Waitakiri Drive,
 - (including Cameo Grove to number 16, Suntory Lane, Araucana Way, Serama Place, Minorca Lane, and Nederland Avenue to number 9)
- North West on Waitakiri Drive to Landfill Ave
 - (including all addresses on Waitakiri Drive, Len Hale Place, Alpine View Lane, John Morel Place, and Timbers Lane)

⁸ Note that the term "Transitional" in the Draft Enrolment Schemes incorporates both Grandparenting and Transitional as one concept which is different to the definitions in the Education Report above. These were separated out for clarity in the Education Report.

- North East on Landfill Ave and east along the southern boundary of Bottle Lake Forest to the ocean,
- South along the coast, west then north around the southern point of the Brighton Spit,
- North up the Avon River (Ōtākaro) to the ANZAC Drive bridge and the intersection of ANZAC Drive and New Brighton Road

Proof of residence within the home zone will be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Transitional Arrangements – for families whose addresses become “out of zone” due to this amendment to the enrolment scheme home zone:

The following addresses shall be deemed to be “in-zone”, but only for as long as they contain the children listed.

NB This is a very tightly defined concession. It would **not apply** to:

- a. children of parents who move in to any of these addresses subsequent to the adoption of the enrolment scheme boundary amendment; and
- b. children of parents currently living at one of the addresses who move out of the address subsequent to the adoption of the enrolment scheme boundary amendment.

Section 11E of the Education Act 1989 states that “a state school’s home zone must be defined by geographic boundaries, and must be described in such a way that any given address is either within or outside the home zone.” The list above is defining a location as “in-zone” unless dictated otherwise by the exceptions outlined in *a* and *b* above.

Special Programmes

This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a Special programme approved by the Secretary.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the Board of Trustees will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:

Fifth Priority

will be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.

Sixth Priority

will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions by the Secretary issued under Section 11G (1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.

Appropriate maps are available at the school and may be viewed to give guidance in identifying the school's geographical zone.

The Board will assist the Principal to monitor roll trends and enrolments to ensure that the application of the scheme is consistent and fair to all.

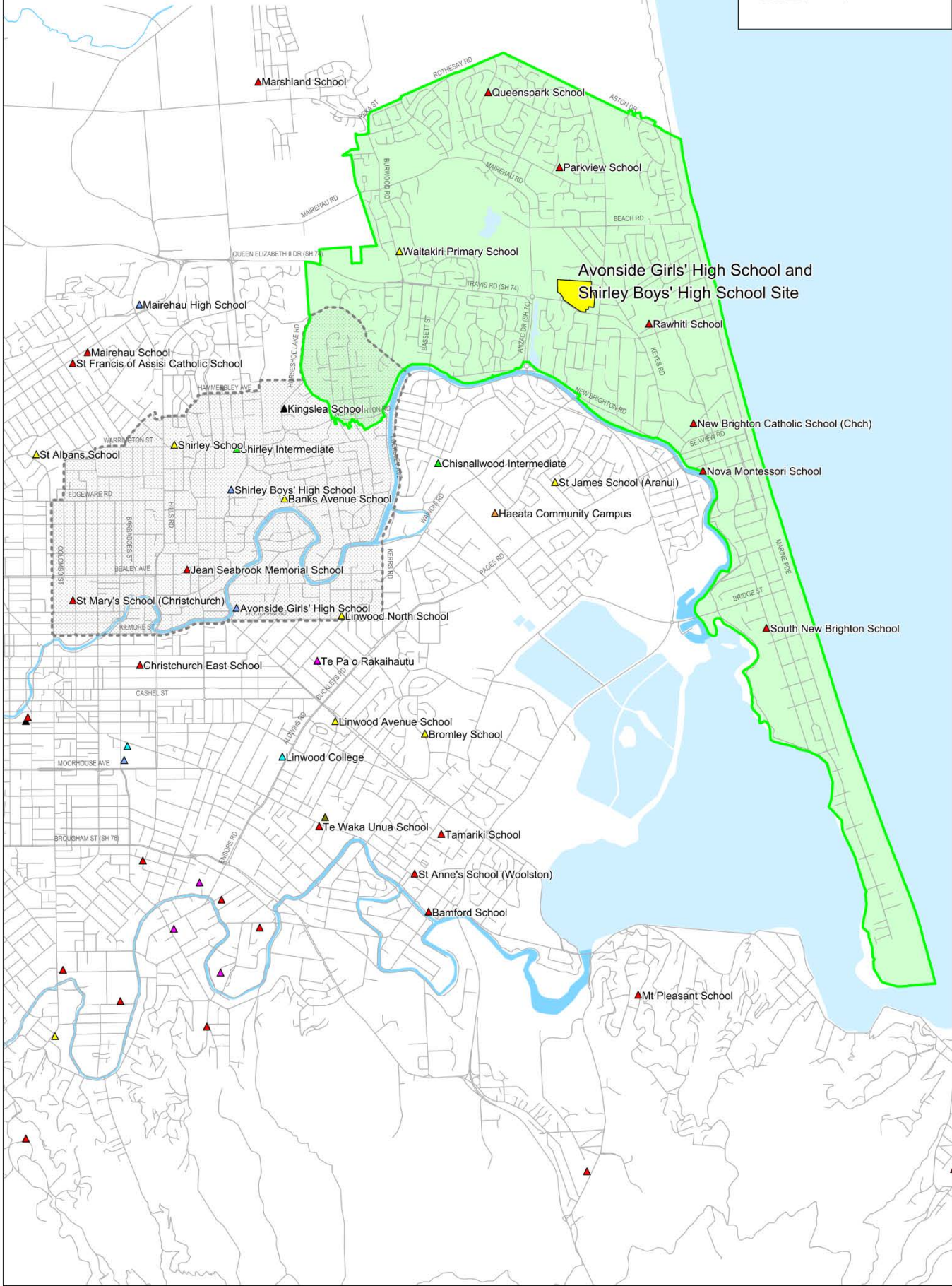
