Year 7 and 8 Technology Provision

We have been attending meetings over the past three weeks to update stakeholders on Year 7 and 8 Technology provision. This has been an opportunity for us to share a summary of the feedback received at the end of the last phase of the consultation and to discuss the next steps.

A technology working group has been formed to take into account the suggested ideas submitted from the initial consultation, to provide more detail around what has been proposed and explore the implications the different options will have on future technology delivery across greater Christchurch.
