Professor Lindsey Conner has been a teacher educator at the Christchurch College of Education and University of Canterbury for 18 years. Previously, Lindsey was a secondary science and biology teacher and Head of Department. She has since been a national examiner in New Zealand, a developer of national standards assessments and assessment tasks, a consultant on developing science curricula and assessment practices internationally and has been involved in numerous international comparative research and development projects on teacher education. Lindsey is the



Director of the Science and Technology Education Research Lab at the University of Canterbury. Her team has been researching the effectiveness of multimodal approaches to learning and the implications for teaching.
