

Community of Practice — Secondary

Why

To create opportunities for the sharing of emerging innovative practice between secondary schools in order to support, challenge and provoke ongoing transformation across the secondary education sector in Canterbury.

Who

Principals, senior and middle leaders from a range of secondary schools across Canterbury (perhaps 2–4 from each school). A community of practice involves ongoing participation and interaction by a group, rather than occasional attendance of some events by different people.

What

The following topics of interest were selected from those negotiated at November meeting;

- Master planning for linking pedagogy and flexible learning spaces.
- Student agency, selfmanagement and vision for learning.
- Flexible timetabling and management systems.
- Collaborative teaching and teacher development.

When



What is Grow Waitaha and what will we do?

Grow Waitaha is the Ministry of Education funded programme to help support schools in Canterbury with collaborative and innovative pedagogy.

Grow Waitaha is a collaboration of the Ministry, Ngai Tahu, CORE Education, Evaluation Associates, Leadership Lab and Massey University School of Design.

Grow Waitaha will provide a series of opportunities for teachers and school leaders to connect and learn from each other around a range of topics.

Grow Waitaha will collect, collate and store a range of resources for teachers, school leaders and parents to access in relation to new ways of teaching and learning.

Grow Waitaha will work to make connections between educators in order to share the best practice already happening across the Canterbury region.

- Our work with the Principal Associations to support their Delving Deep conference, a one day exchange of best practice activities that are happening in canterbury schools.
